Spencer continued to be ranked on the world list until she won the bronze medal in the 2016 Olympics.

He begged the doctor to not remove it and returned in 1950 to win his second IHSAA state meet. In his senior year, family conditions forced him to join the army, where he won the Medal of Honor.

Opal "Shagg" Courtney Gary Roosevelt

A native Gary, Indiana, Opal "Shagg" Courtney was one of the greatest all-around scholastic athletes in the country. He was outstanding on track and basketball and later added football to his resume. He nearly alone won National Interscholastic Track Championship in 1930 at Lincoln University, 1931 at Hampton Institute and runner-up in 1932 at Hampton Institute. Courtney held interscholastic records in the high jump, broad jump, pole vault, shot put and high and low hurdles at Hampton Institute and Lincoln University. He later played for the Harlem Globetrotters and developed to spin of the ball on one finger.

Otha Thomas

Otha won the 1961 IHSAA State Meet long jump with a record jump of 23'3.5" that broke Earl Smith, Gary Roosevelt 23'2.5" that stood for 20 years.
